Approved Camping Sites for Cub Scout Packs

The Old North State Council is continuously updating the list of camping sites that are approved for overnight Cub Scout Pack use. This procedure follows the Guide to Safe Scouting and is assessed using the "Pack Overnight Campout Site Appraisal Form" dated 2018.

Pack overnight events are defined as:

"These are pack-organized overnight events involving more than one family from a single pack, focused on age-appropriate activities and conducted at council-approved locations (councils use Pack Overnight Campout Site Appraisal Form, No. 430-902). If nonmembers (siblings) participate, the event must be structured accordingly to accommodate them. BSA Health and Safety and Youth Protection policies apply. In most cases, each youth member will be under the supervision of a parent or guardian. In all cases, each youth participant is responsible to a specific adult.

At least one adult on a pack overnigher must have completed Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO, No 34162) to properly understand the importance of program intent, Youth Protection policies, health and safety, site selection, age-appropriate activities and sufficient adult participation."

All Cub Scout Packs that wish to conduct an overnight activity at a location other than property owned by a Boy Scout Council, it must use a site that has been approved by the "local Boy Scout Council" to ensure that the site is appropriate for Cub Scouts. If a Pack uses a site that has not been approved by a local Boy Scout Council, those adult leaders will risk personal liability should an incident occur during the activity

If your pack knows of a camping site they would like to use for an overnight activity in the near future, please send the name, address, and contact information of that site to Old North State Council Program Director for approval. This process is only for those camping sites that are located within the boundaries of the Old North State Council. Sites in other areas must be approved by the appropriate local Boy Scout Council.

Please make sure you submit the request at least 4 weeks before the date of your planned overnight activity. This will ensure that there is plenty of time for the council to conduct the site inspection and approve the site. Once a site is approved, it will be added to the master list of approved sites for two years at which time it will need to be re-inspected.
